



Attestation Process

All psychologists registered or practicing in Nova Scotia are expected to possess or demonstrate an understanding of professional practice and ethical issues, and have an understanding of the practice of psychology in NS (public and private system).

As such, prior to registration with the Nova Scotia Board of Examiners in Psychology, applicants are required to attest that they have reviewed the following relevant local jurisprudence, standards, and resources:

- the NSRP Standards of Professional Conduct;
- the NSRP Standards for Providers of Psychological Services;
- the Canadian Code of Ethics for Psychologists (Fourth Edition);
- the Regulated Health Professions Act, 2023
- the RHPA General Regulations (June 2024)
- the Psychology Regulations (November 2024)
- the NSRP Bylaws (November 2025)
- if practicing via telepsychology, NSRP Practice Advisory: Model Standards for Telepsychology Service
- and other legislation and guidelines applicable to registrants.
