Board Meeting Summary¹

April 17, 2026

1. Approval of Agenda and Minutes

The Board approved the April 17, 2026 agenda and the minutes of the March 20, 2026 meeting.

2. Board Annual Work Plan 2026–2027

The Board adopted the Board Annual Work Plan and meeting schedule for 2026–2027.

The Board considered and was updated on the Quality Assurance Program (QAP) Action Plan, including its required deliverable deadlines of June 30 and September 30, 2026, with the deliverables reflected in the work plan sequencing.

3. Academic Rate — General Register Fee Structure

In conjunction with the 2026–2027 budget, the Board approved continuation of an Academic Rate of \$100 per year within the General Register, available to fully licensed registrants whose primary professional activity is the teaching or research of psychology, subject to annual attestation at renewal.

4. Annual Budget 2026–2027

The Board approved the operating budget for the fiscal year July 1, 2026 to June 30, 2027 as presented, together with the reauthorization of up to \$50,000 from reserves.

5. Diversity and Inclusion Committee

The Board directed the Diversity and Inclusion Committee to develop a draft EDIRA (equity, diversity, inclusion, reconciliation and accessibility) Statement for NSRP, to be brought back to the Board for approval.

6. Oral Examination Process

The Board referred the oral examination process to the Executive Director and Registrar for review, including consideration of alignment with the duty to report under section 60(1) of the Regulated Health Professions Act. A proposed committee structure and process will be brought back to the Board.

7. In Camera Session

Portions of the meeting were confidential to the Board. No matters from those discussions are reportable under section 6(2) of the Regulated Health Professions General Regulations.

8. Adjournment

The meeting adjourned.
