As of November 24, 2025, the Nova Scotia Board of Examiners in Psychology (NSBEP) has successfully migrated to the Regulated Health Professions Act (RHPA). This marks an important step in modernizing regulation in Nova Scotia, while ensuring a consistent, transparent framework that protects the public while supporting safe, ethical practice.

What This Means for You

- **Our New Name:** We are now the Nova Scotia Regulator of Psychology (NSRP). You'll see this reflected in our communications and website in the coming days and weeks.
- **No Immediate Changes to Your Practice:** Your registration, license, and renewal processes remain the same. We continue to recognize interprovincial mobility, and there are no disruptions to registration, complaints or operations.
- **Key RHPA Benefits:** The Act introduces stronger tools for fair decision-making, including independent statutory committees and enhanced public transparency.

We're committed to making this transition as smooth as possible and will keep you informed through email and our website. We'll soon provide information about the bylaws approved on November 24, 2025, new committee structures, and any minor procedural updates (none of which affect current practice).
